

## Story Making Questions

- the 5 ws are a place to start and then go from there
- "Tell me about this."
- Tell me what's happening
- What this means to you? Tell me about this?
- How does your character feel?
- Story elements: Who is in the story? What problem is occurring?
- What are the characters thinking/saying/feeling? (Use thought bubbles ... similar to vocab cards)
  - Add facial expressions.
  - Tell me more about \_\_\_\_\_
  - Lead into science topic wonders.
- "how does he/she/they feel?"
- Who is taking care in your story? What are they taking care of? How do they feel as they take care?
- Do you have a connection to the story (does it come from your personal experience?)
- I'm curious about what is happening here in your story?
- how is \_\_\_\_ feeling?
- how do you feel?
- Tell me about this?
- Additional wait time after asking "what's happening in this story?"

- find questions from their responses.
- What would happen if...
- I wonder why \_\_\_\_\_?
- Why did you choose to create this story?
- What happens next?
- Where is this taking place? What season is it?
- Tell me more about...
- How does your character feel?
- Have you ever experienced this/felt this way?
- what is your character feeling?
- I think the who what where when question to start.
- what is your character thinking?
- Ask where your story is taking place
- Tell me more....
- 5 senses questions - what do they hear, see, taste, smell, feel (touch and emotions)
- Where are they, have you been to a place like that?
- What made you think of that?
- What is happening here?

- What is your science wonder?
- What is the problem in your story. How are you going to solve it?
- “How does this relate/connect to your real life” though I’d word it in simpler terms of course
- i would love to know more about these pieces over here
- Have you ever been to a place like the one you created here? If so, tell me about your experience.
- How did your character feel when this happened ?
- ask to use their imagination
- What does this piece (ie. pinecone) represent?
